We look to address the multiple barriers people are faced with following a period of homelessness, and fight the stigma attached, to allow them to progress with practical support in place.

Mark joined the ReFresh program to help build his confidence and help with anxiety. Through one of our corporate supporters, he has managed to secure a work experience placement with a joinery company and is really enjoying the experience.



PAT Testing



By being able to PAT test donations, we are able to reuse, recycle and distribute them to our service users, contributing to the 75,000 kg that is saved from landfill by Fresh Start each year.

Structure and Governance




